Alzheimer's disease (AD) is frustrating. Sudden outbursts of anger, aggression or agitation can be part of Alzheimer's disease progression. Managing these symptoms can be difficult. But, you're not alone! Doctors are working daily to find treatments.

The HarmonyAD clinical research study is being conducted to determine if an investigational drug given as a pill can safely and effectively reduce the symptoms of agitation and aggression in people with Alzheimer's disease.

**To take part in the study, individuals must:**

- Be at least 50 years old
- Have a diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease
- Experience at least moderate agitation and/or aggression
- Exhibit agitation and/or aggression at least once a week
- Have a study partner, informant or caregiver who is willing to support and be involved in the AD patient's participation in the study

The study will last approximately 3 months, during which participants will attend 7 clinic study visits and 4 telephone contact visits.

Participants will be monitored throughout the study. The investigational drug and study-related procedures will be provided at no cost. Cost of travel and meals related to the study may be reimbursed.
